






The Fundamentals





Rule of Thirds

Place key elements along the grid lines or at their intersections





Leading Lines


Use lines within your scene to guide the viewer's eye toward the main subject

Symmetry

Balance elements on either side for a harmonious photograph.



Lighting Fundamentals

Natural	Artificial	Exposing
Natural light, such as sunlight, is a versatile and powerful lighting source that can create stunning effects.	Artificial light sources, like lamps and LEDs, can be controlled and directed to achieve desired effects.	Exposure ensures your photo isn't too dark or too bright, balancing light and shadow.
Utilize the peak times to shoot eg: Golden Hour, Midday Light, Blue Hour	Artificial light can be manipulated in terms of intensity, direction, and color, making it highly versatile.	Use your phone's exposure tools like HDR, and manual adjustments to manipulate exposure
Positioning is key	Use diffused light where possible	Exposure demo






Types of Focus


- Auto-Focus: Most smartphone cameras

 automatically adjust the focus based on what they
 detect as the subject. It's user-friendly and
 convenient.
- Portrait Mode: Many smartphones have a portrait mode that simulates shallow depth of field by using software to blur the background.
- Tap to Focus: Tap on your subject on the screen to ensure the camera focuses correctly, especially in complex scenes.





Depth of Field





Shallow Depth

Only a small part of the image is in focus, with the rest blurred.



Deep Depth

A larger portion of the image is in focus, both the foreground and background





Editing Essentials

- Basic Adjustments: Improve exposure, contrast, and color balance for better photos.
- Cropping and Straightening: Improve composition ()/and focus by removing distractions and correcting angles.
- Filters and Presets: Change the look and feel of your photos with filters and presets. Experiment!
 - Exporting and Sharing: Properly exporting your edited photos ensures they look their best. *JPEG for general use, PNG for high-quality web images.


